Can they explain how a location fits into its wider geographical location; with reference to physical features? Can they describe the main features of a well-known city? Geographical Knowledge (EYFS)	Can the children say which country/city they are from?	
Geographical Knowledge (Year 1)	 Can they point out where the equator, north pole and south pole are on a globe or atlas? Can they identify the four countries making up the United Kingdom? Can they name some of the main towns and cities in the United Kingdom? 	
Geographical Knowledge (Year 2)	 Can they name a few towns in the south and north of the UK? Can they find where they live on a map of the UK? Can they name the major cities of England, Wales, Scotland and Ireland? Can they name the continents of the world and find them in an atlas? Can they name the world's oceans and find them in an atlas? Challenge: 	
	 Can they point out the North, South, East and West associated with maps and compass? Can they locate some of the world's major rivers and mountain ranges? 	
Geographical Knowledge (Year 3)	 Can they name a number of countries in the Northern Hemisphere? Can they name and locate some well-known European countries? Can they name and locate the capital cities of neighbouring European countries? Are they aware of different weather in different parts of the world, especially Europe? Can they locate and name some of the world's most famous volcanoes? 	
	Can they name the two largest seas around Europe?	
Geographical Knowledge	 Can they locate the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn? Do they know the difference between the British Isles, Great Britain and UK? Can they locate and name some of the main islands that surround the UK? 	
(Year 4)	 Can they name the areas of origin of the main ethnic groups in the UK & in their school? Can they name up to six cities in the UK and locate them on a map? 	

Geographical Knowledge (Year 5)	 Can they name and locate many of the world's major rivers on maps? Can they name and locate many of the world's most famous mountain regions on maps? Can they locate the USA and Canada on a world map and atlas? Can they locate and name the main countries in South America on a world map and atlas? Can they name the counties that make up the home counties of London?
Geographical Knowledge (Year 6)	 Can they recognise key symbols used on ordnance survey maps? Can they name the largest desert in the world? Can they identify and name the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn as well as the Artic and Antarctic circles? Can they explain how the time zones work? Challenge: Can they name the main lines of latitude and meridian of longitude?
